EXECUTIVE SUMMARY: CEO'S MONTHLY UPDATE

July 2025 has been an exceptionally vibrant month for Africa for SDGs, marked by significant strides in youth empowerment, sustainable development education, and community engagement across Kenya. We've witnessed remarkable dedication from our student chapters and partners, translating into tangible impact on the ground. This month, our programs reached over 1,800 direct participants across various initiatives, including entrepreneurship training, ESD forums, mentorship sessions, and community action.

A key highlight was the expansion of our "Agile" entrepreneurship program, training 123 primary school pupils in Mombasa County. Our ESD for SDGs Forums continued to thrive, engaging over 60 healthcare students and reactivating an ESD club at Machakos School with 20 learners. We also facilitated critical discussions on youth skills development, reaching over 20 webinar participants and making a profound impact at the Kilifi County Comrades Association's Mega Mentorship Program, where over 1,000 students and approximately 150 youth were addressed.

Furthermore, our commitment to gender equality and community well-being was exemplified by the launch of the WOMEN L.I.F.E program, engaging 28 participants in its initial session. The dedication of our student chapters from institutions like Pwani University, KMTC, and Kenya Coast National Polytechnic was instrumental, culminating in impactful events like the planting of over 5,000 mangrove seedlings.

These numbers are more than just statistics; they represent lives touched, minds enlightened, and a collective step forward towards a sustainable Africa. We are immensely proud of these achievements and remain steadfast in our mission to raise young leaders who will shape a sustainable future for all.

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

WORLD YOUTH SKILLS DAY ONLINE WEBINAR ON AI AND DIGITAL SKILLS


15TH JULY 2025 ONLINE

20 learners (Form 2s and 3s) actively participated, given that Form 4 students were engaged in examinations.



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

Volunteering medical students from the North Coast Medical Training College (NCMTC) Students for Sustainable Development Goals (SSDGs) chapter successfully hosted a comprehensive medical camp. The initiative focused on mainstreaming SDG 3: Good Health and Well-being, providing essential health screenings, counseling (including STI and family planning), and first aid services to the community. This effort aimed to empower individuals with crucial health knowledge and foster overall well-being.

187 individuals were screened, including 50 teachers, 80 church members, and 57 general community members/visitors. This highlighted community health needs, with several cases of undiagnosed high blood pressure and blood sugar identified, alongside providing first aid to 10 individuals.



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












SDG CHAPTER SPOTLIGHT: CELEBRATING KMTC SIGOWET'S AMAZING WORK

GLOBAL COACHES PROGRAM SPOTLIGHT

Establishing Urban Microfarming Techniques Demo Plot

Under the Global Coaches Program, Africa for SDGs is actively promoting urban organic farming through the establishment of a demonstration plot showcasing various microfarming methods.

This vital initiative is proudly led by Tom Oketch and Kepha Rabon Asilikwa from the University of Nairobi (UON) Upper Kabete SDG Chapters. These innovative techniques include raised moist gardens, cone gardens, moist beds, and hydroponics. The project emphasizes the utilization of small available spaces for food production, leveraging readily available and repurposed materials such as tires, plastic bottles, pipes, and polythene bags to produce nutritious food.

Impact and Aims: This initiative is strategically designed to foster eco-friendly farming practices, create new employment opportunities, and significantly enhance food security within urban communities. Through a series of planned training sessions and workshops, the project aims to equip participants with the skills and knowledge to implement these sustainable farming methods, contributing to resilient food systems.
